³ Items in small caps are requirements that have been added to the major requirements (e.g. Math 32/32L)

⁴ Requires successful completion or demonstrated proficiency. Students may pursue different paths (e.g. Math 25 & 26 = Math 31; Math 31 & 32 = Math 41.)

⁵ Math 102 or Math 103 or demonstrated proficiency by placing out of Math 103 or successfully completing a higher-level Math course with Math 103 as a pre-requisite. Because Math placement is not on a student's official academic record, those seeking a demonstrated proficiency waiver should secure Econ DUS approval. Students who matriculated prior to Fall 2006 may waive the Math 102 requirement.

⁶ This requirement may be replaced by another 100-level economics course with permission from the DUS.
